3	<p>Epidemiological Update 1) COVID 19 Update WHO briefed the health Partners on the latest Yemen epidemiological update on COVID 19 (As of 5th October) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 2045 cases reported (0 cases reported in last 24 hours) - 593 cases of mortality reported (one case in the last 24 hours) - Cases recovered stand at 1325 - 11 Governorate affected - Test Conducted 8493 conducted in the south from 5 CPHL Latest Epidemiological update: Yemen COVID 19 Dashboard and attached cluster PPT 2) Cholera Outbreak Update MoPHP briefed the health Partners on the latest Yemen epidemiological update on Cholera Outbreak (As of Week 38). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 43,652 cases of suspected Cholera reported with 28 associated death (CFR 0.06%) - Most affected governorates are Taiz and Al Bayda - 56% of case are male - Most affected age groups are 5 to 14 years closely followed by under 5 and 15 to 29 years - Significant drop in cases in 2020 compared to 2019 - Most affected district in Taiz At Taiziyah closely followed by Salh and Al Mudhafar - Most affected districts in Al Bayda is At Taffah and Mukayras For more information please find in the attached cluster PPT </p>	<p>☐ MoPHP/Surveillance to disaggregate cholera data and provide analysis according to zones/villages</p>

4	<p>RCCE Update – Response in IDP Camps</p> <p>UNICEF C4D focal person updated members on RCCE activities in IDP camps.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - UNICEF installed megaphones in 5 IDPs centers: 2 in Aden (Khalid Bin Waleed and Al-Shab), 2 in Abyan(Alkoodand Zinjubar) and 1 in Lahj- with recorders announcing essential messages and spots 3 times a day IDPs can hear while in their tents or rooms. - Awareness creation through Social media like WhatsApp groups - Distribution of washable face masks to over 30,000 IDPs in Aden, Lahej, Hadramout, Abyan and Mahra including Somali refugees’ students. - Distribution of cleaning materials to 2500 families - Tagging food commodities with RCCE information stickers - In coordination with WHO UNICEF is Community based case surveillance. <p>Challenges faced are maintaining social distancing in overcrowded IDP centers</p> <p>For more information please find in the attached cluster PPT</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> Establishment of RCCE Working forum</p>
5	<p>Information Management:</p> <p>The health cluster team briefed members on need to map out the activities of COVID 19. The health cluster has developed a specific tool that will be linked the health cluster platform for the monthly data collection (DHS2). Previously, the data was collected via excel format that covered both pillar 7 and 9. The tool is currently been developed and will be rolled soon. 6	<p>Community Shielding – COVID 19 Prevention</p> <p>IMC briefed the member on a project that they collaborated with DRC in which will promote community shielding for the most at risk of COVID 19(the elderly and those with chronic diseases) will have limited contact with persons in the household to ensure that exposure to COVID-19 remains minimal. The project will cover 16 communities in Al Khoka and Tahayta districts in Al Hudayda governorate. Some of the challenges already identified include</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Lower income families are not able to adopt the shielding practice due to limited resources. - Insufficient space inside houses for shielding to succeed - Limited access to health services. <p>For more detailed information please find in the Cluster PPT.</p>
